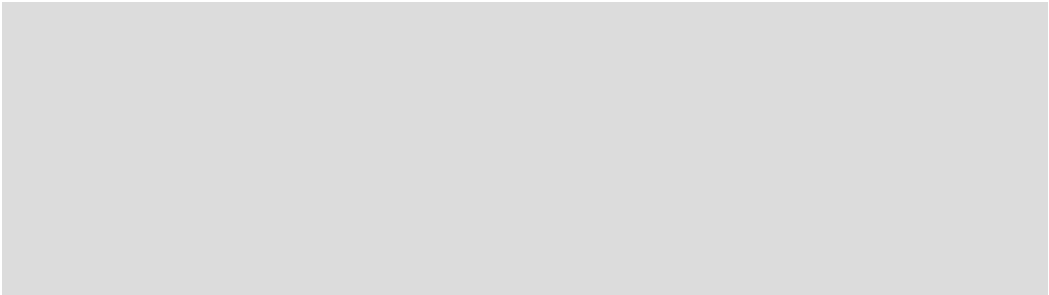

This last spring at the Texas State Historical Association and the Great Plains Honors Council Northeast had an anomalous windfall of awards that centered on the above-mentioned Gabriela Quezada, Hector Zuniga, Melody Mott, Andrew Yox, Emma Lea Shaw and William Jones. Zuniga won a first place (\$400) State of Texas Caldwell Award in the Junior Senior division for his work on Governor William Hobby, who he also played in our \$600 Caldwell Award-winning film. Mott was the first person in our college's history to win a Smallwood Scholarship (\$500) and while she was at it, a 2nd-place Caldwell (\$300) for the lower division. Shaw won a 3rd-place Caldwell for her pioneering work on school integration in Northeast Texas which related to sports. Two other high points of the TSHA are that Jesica Jarama saw her first publication Touchstone and Andrew Yox won the top financial award of the TSHA: the \$5K Bryan Leadership in Education Award.
